



Dermatology Specialists of Omaha is committed to keeping our community safe. We continue to actively plan, prepare, and prevent the spread of illness.

Please read our updated safety policies regarding your appointment.

- If the patient or anyone in the family is experiencing any type of illness, please reschedule without penalty at 402-330-4555. This includes current or recent (3 days) fever, cough, nasal congestion, sore or scratchy throat, loss of taste or smell, shortness of breath, fatigue, headache, or any known exposure to COVID-19 for anyone in the household.
- No visitors are allowed to accompany patients for their visits. For the safety of everyone, only the patient and (if required for care) one guardian/parent will enter DSO facility. We kindly ask all other siblings, family, grandparents, and nannies to either remain at home or wait in the car for the visit. Please call ahead if this creates a hardship. This reduces the exposures for our vulnerable patients and staff and enables better social distancing in our waiting room and exam rooms.
- All patients are always required to wear an appropriate face mask while in the building. Surgical, KN95 and cloth masks are allowed. Valve masks are NOT allowed unless covered with an additional mask. If you arrive without a mask, you may purchase a mask while supplies last.
- When you arrive for your appointment a staff member will take your temperature and review the COVID-19 screening criteria. If you screen positive, we will ask you to return home. We will assist you in rescheduling from home.
- After checking in, you may wait in our waiting area or in some cases patients may choose to or be asked to wait in their cars.
- You must always keep your mask on while in the building, even if you are in a private room. This reduces aerosols in our building. The doctor will ask you to remove your mask if needed for a facial exam/procedure. If your mask is off for an exam, please do not speak until the mask is replaced.
- DSO continues to completely disinfect all patients' areas between every patient encounter.
